

Each month Angie and Tom receive a letter and framed tribute from parents who lost a son on April 6, 2018. And provided by Dawg Nation, there is also a \$1,000 check to help the Petersen family during Angie's studies. "We simply can't do it without all of you!"





Mark Borgen has played hockey for over 20 years. The Minnesota native is a big Boston Bruins fan who suffered a severe shoulder injury during a game. Mark couldn't work and medical bills kept coming. In February, the Dawgs and Mark's teammates surprised him with a check for \$11,000 that will provide for physical therapy and more. Borgs continues to recover and hopes to be back on skates soon.



Mila Ekstrom is five and was recently diagnosed with leukemia. Her brother, Sebastian, and his "Scrappy Dawgs" hockey teammates were quick to come to her aid. Scrappy Dawgs played in the 9280 Pond Hockey event at Keystone Ski Area in January.



The Scrappy Dawgs raised \$1000. Folks like you donated another \$1,000 and Dawg Nation added \$6,000 for a very special check to help Mila's family. Mila is currently

receiving chemotherapy. She's with dad Gavin, brother Sebastian and mom Amber.
